

COMMISSIONERS MINUTES

AUGUST 25, 2014

The Elmore County Commissioners met in regular session on the above date in the Commissioners Room, basement of the Elmore County Courthouse, 150 South 4th East, Mountain Home, Idaho.

Present at the meeting were Chairman Al Hofer, Commissioners Bud Corbus and Wes Wootan, Civil Attorney Buzz Grant, Clerk Barbara Steele, and Deputy Clerk Shelley Hooper.

Martin Beach, Mountain Home Highway District Commissioner, appeared to discuss the recent mudslide devastation. The Trinity Ridge Fire, Elk Complex Fire and Pony Creek Fire have caused a lack of ground cover which in turn is causing flash flooding, mudslides and major road damage. The district crews have been restoring damaged roads and bridges that citizens rely on daily, which has been extremely costly to the district.

Trecia McCain, County Comptroller, appeared to discuss an issue with a property included in today’s tax deed sale. The property in question has a trailer situated on the property. The owner is paying on a distraint warrant for the trailer, but is not paying the property taxes. Ms. McCain is not sure how the county should proceed with the sale of the property, since they can’t take deed on the trailer. The board decided to postpone the sale of that property until the issue is researched further.

The monthly department head meeting was held.

Jeff Day, Waterways Department, appeared to update the board. He is still working on the Hammett Boat Ramp project.

Brian Chevalier, Pine EMS Supervisor, appeared to update the board. He has gotten several of the EMS vehicles serviced and all of the outdated supplies have been replaced. He has been working on recruiting volunteers and has some new volunteers lined up. There will be coverage for Labor Day weekend, he will be working and will have a volunteer working as well.

Wade Baumgardner, Veteran Service Officer, appeared. He has been working diligently on the “Atomic” veteran claim and was successful in getting an 85% disability compensation award approved for the veteran’s hearing loss claim. The VA is still evaluating documents for his radiation exposure claim. He participated in a funeral for a 92 year old retired Navy veteran at the Mountain Home Cemetery. He was

successful in getting hearing aids for a local veteran with a cost savings of about \$6,000.00 out of pocket. Since the last meeting he has assisted twenty eight veterans, spouses and family members with specific VA issues.

Mir Seyedbagheri, Extension Office, appeared to update the board of his monthly progress. Mr. Seyedbagheri has been training his new pest department employee on the winter comprehensive plan and has sent him to training for mosquito identification and speciation. The new employee is very hard working and dedicated and Mr. Seyedbagheri would highly recommend that the county hire him on a full time basis as he has become a great asset to the pest department.

Emma Scott-Landers, Drug Court Coordinator, appeared to give her monthly update. They currently have twenty eight participants in the program and four pending entrances. Twenty six of the participants are employed. Anyone not employed must volunteer a minimum of twenty hours per week, complete five hours of documented job search and must submit ten job applications per week. The third annual Recovery Walk and Crawdad Feed will be held on September 27, 2014 at Richard Aguirre Park. The next graduation will be November 18, 2014.

Steve Dye, Juvenile Probation Director, appeared to give his monthly update. He reviewed his case load report. They have some complex cases, but the probation officers are handling them well. He has hired a new community services employee to supervise the juveniles while doing community service projects. Mr. Dye reviewed his revised compensation policy, where employees are required to use comp time before vacation time, unless they have too many vacation hours accumulated, then they will be required to use their vacation time first.

Alan Christy, Land Use and Building Department Director, appeared. He updated the board of his research regarding herd districts. No other counties that he spoke with have ordinance for herd districts, they revert to state ordinance. Anyone with questions regarding forming or expanding a herd district should consult Idaho Code. He provided the board with a map of the existing herd districts within Elmore County. Mr. Christy and the Planning and Zoning Commission will hold a meeting at the Pine Senior Center on September 30th regarding the issue of the number of RV's that can be on one property at a time. According to county ordinance, currently only one RV is allowed on a property at a time. The meeting will address "temporary" private use of the RV's, including the number of RV's, how many days they can be parked on site and utility availability. There will be a hearing regarding the Comprehensive Plan on September 17, 2014.

Alan Lawler, Resource, Conservation and Development (RC&D), appeared. Mr. Lawler was asked to update the board on the Extrication Department as Alan Roberts was unable to attend the meeting. They conducted an extrication awareness class for the Fairfield Fire Department on Saturday. On the RC&D side, he had applied for grant to fund the construction of a domestic water well for the Oasis Fire Department. He received word that the grant was not approved, so he is still working on other funding

possibilities. RC&D has \$2,000.00 available for emergency services, so he has talked with Carol Killian, Disaster Services Coordinator, about getting some extra equipment for the dispatch center. Glenns Ferry has received plan approval from RC&D to look for grant funding for a pump system to grab water from the river and push it through the existing irrigation system into “fill stations”, to be used during fire events.

Carol Killian, Disaster Services Coordinator, and Dale Nalder, Idaho Bureau of Homeland Security (BHS), appeared to update the board of the mudslide and flooding damages and the status of funding assistance requests. Mr. Nalder did some research on the damages to the road in Atlanta and found that it is a federal highway and he believes that the federal government will provide funding for “emergency repairs” to that road, to make it passable and bring it back to pre-disaster condition. That will not include improvements or permanent repairs to the road. Ms. Killian prepared a letter for the board to sign to submit to Governor Otter’s office, along with any other pertinent information, to request a disaster declaration from his office. If the governor approves a disaster declaration, Ms. Killian can then request funding assistance through the BHS on an incident by incident basis. Mr. Nalder recommended that the county commit to an initial amount of funding to help with the repairs. He will also be available to Ms. Killian to assist her in the funding request process. Discussion followed regarding the extensive repairs that will be needed and forecasted costs of the repairs.

Motion by Corbus, second by Wootan, to approve funding to the Mountain Home Highway District and the Atlanta Highway District, with the amount of funding not to exceed \$200,000.00. The funding will be distributed on a case by case basis for repairs to areas located within Elmore County due to the mudslide and flooding disasters.

Rena Kerfoot, Fair Board, appeared and presented the board with the 2014 Elmore County Fair and Rodeo overview. Their grand totals are up from last year’s fair. They are already working on booking entertainment and rodeo acts for next year’s fair and rodeo. They are moving forward with upgrades to the grounds. She has met with Idaho Power to install addition power sources. They have purchased materials to build a permanent beef show ring this fall.

Bill Wenner, Misdemeanor Probation, appeared. The total number of clients on probation is one hundred eighty. As of this date, eight clients were added to the case load and five clients were released or terminated from probation. The number of conditional release clients is thirty seven and there are six restitution cases. There are thirty nine clients enrolled in community services, which is the number of clients on unsupervised probation only. They are researching a new company to do their drug testing.

Shauna Kellerman, Jail Commander, appeared to update the board. The total jail population as of August 25, 2014 is ninety two. The population has been increasing for the past few months, which may be due in part to having several Idaho Department of Corrections holds.

The monthly elected officials meeting was held.

Treasurer Rose Plympton updated the board. Her office has sent out letters concerning the 2011 overdue taxes. They had sent out three hundred letters, the highest they have ever had to send out.

Prosecuting Attorney Kristina Schindele appeared to discuss a personnel issue with the board.

Motion by Hofer, second by Corbus, to go into Executive Session pursuant to I.C. 67-2345(b)(f) to discuss a personnel issue and possible litigation. Roll call vote was taken.

Sheriff Rick Layher and Chief Deputy Mike Barclay appeared to update the board of a meeting with Mel Coulter, Idaho Transportation Department (ITD) and members of the Orchard Combat Training Center, regarding emergency response to fire events on Interstate 84. Orchard has entered into an agreement with ITD to provide emergency services on a stretch of Interstate 84. Part of the area is located in Elmore County and there is an issue of incident command status if Orchard responds to an event. Sheriff Layher stated that the issue was discussed in length at the meeting and Mr. Coulter will work on revising the contract to make it work for all emergency responders involved.

Dustin Fink, of Penner & Fink, Inc., appeared and reviewed the 2014-2015 Idaho Counties Risk Management Program (ICRMP) insurance renewal proposal. Included in the renewal was the Terrorism Risk Insurance rejection form, which will need to be signed if additional coverage is not desired. There was a question of whether the county's insurance would cover repairs to county roads due to the recent mudslides and flooding. Mr. Fink feels that roads will probably not be covered, since they are not "structures", but he will contact ICRMP regarding the issue.
