## ELMORE COUNTY SECOND EXTENSION OF DECLARATION OF LOCAL DISASTER EMERGENCY

### **RESOLUTION NO. 523-13**

AT A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF ELMORE COUNTY (the "County") COMMISSIONERS (the "Board"), STATE OF IDAHO, ON THE 19<sup>TH</sup> DAY OF AUGUST, 2013, THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED, TO WIT;

**WHEREAS**, the First Extension contained a scrivener's error and the Board corrected such error and restated the First Extension of the Declaration of Local Disaster Emergency by passing Resolution No. 522-13 (the "Corrected First Extension") on August 15, 2013, extending the declaration of local disaster from August 16, 2013 through August 23, 2013; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board desires to further extend the declaration of local disaster emergency from August 23, 2013 through August 30, 2013; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board, pursuant to Idaho Code §46-1011, has the authority to declare a state of local disaster emergency regarding the County; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the wild fires located in the County, commonly known and referred to as the Pony Complex Fire and the Elk Complex Fire, are a local disaster emergency; and

**WHEREAS**, a local disaster emergency exists in the County and the County requires state emergency assistance to supplement local efforts to protect life and property and to activate the response and recovery aspects of any and all applicable local or intergovernmental disaster emergency plans and to authorize the furnishing of aid and assistance thereunder; and

**WHEREAS,** the Board requests that the Governor of the State of Idaho, together with the other appropriate state officials, along with other appropriate federal officials, to make such declarations, and provide such assistance within County as required and allowed by law.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that Elmore County Board of Commissioners does hereby declare, pursuant to Idaho Code §46-1011, that a local disaster emergency exits in Elmore County, Idaho; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Governor of the State of Idaho be advised of this local disaster emergency and is requested to take all action available for the amelioration of the above described local disaster emergency; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Elmore County Recorder be directed to properly file this Resolution pursuant to Idaho Code Section 46-1011 and that the Elmore County Clerk provide prompt and general publicity of this declaration.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this Resolution shall remain in effect for seven days, from August 23, 2013 through August 30, 2013, unless it is extended by the Elmore County Board of Commissioners.

A meeting was held regarding ways to help supplement ranchers who were devastated by the Pony Complex and Elk Complex Fires. The Board advised residents to contact the assessor's office regarding significant property loss and tax adjustments. Several representatives from government agencies, including Congressman Mike Simpson and Senator Jim Risch were present to update the audience of the assistance available to residents devastated by the fires. Senator Bert Bracket was scheduled to attend, but was delayed at an airport out of town and unable to attend. The Elmore County Disaster Task Force List, comprised of names and phone numbers of individuals to contact for information on assistance related to the fires, was handed out to the audience. The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) has started a Burn Emergency Action Response (BEAR) Team and requested that Dave Humphreys, of the Elmore County Extension Office, be on the team as the Elmore County representative. Commissioner Corbus stated that some of the major concerns are fencing issues on private lands and federal grounds, seeding and rehab of

the lands. Due to the loss of feed, there may be a possibility of range exchange or opening up additional grazing areas for ranchers to share. There may also be programs available to defer capital gains taxes if ranchers have to sell their herds due to lack of grazing. Congressman Simpson stated they are currently working on passing the Farm Bill. John Revier, of Congressman Simpson's, office explained the Emergency Livestock Assistance Program, which covers losses on non-federal lands and the Emergency Haying and Grazing Program which are covered in the Farm Bill. Senator Jim Risch stated that what he is looking for is specific needs from ranchers. He will then take those needs to the subcommittees for the Spending Bill. Holly Hampton of the Forest Service spoke about the BEAR Support Team. The Forest Service will be working jointly with BLM, starting with the Pony Complex fire this week. Her team will spend one week in the field collecting data, then next week will be spent putting together proposals, budgets, etc. They will try to do as much seeding and mulching as possible, along with culvert replacement, to try and keep as much soil on the ground as possible so water systems are not lost. Ms. Hampton discussed BEAR money and other monies that are available for different projects. Rancher Skip Owens spoke of large fuel loads and stated that something needs to be done to prevent future fires. Connie Tharp, of the Natural Resources Conservation Service, stated that they are moving ahead with the Emergency Watershed Protection project and will be doing detailed analysis of the fire damaged areas to make sure they can provide as much funding as possible. Jeff Groat, Executive Director of the Farm Service Agency, stated that his department is also working on getting the Farm Bill passed. Mr. Groat stated that residents need to keep precise documentation of livestock issues and losses, whether they died in the fire, or even after the fires due to smoke inhalation issues. The documentation will be an important part of being involved with retroactive programs once the Farm Bill is passed. John Biar, of the Idaho State Department of Agriculture (ISDA) stated the ISDA has compiled a list of websites and potential resources that may be of help to those ranchers affected by the fires. Anyone looking for information on available resources or points of contact can go to www.agri.idaho.gov and links will be available on the homepage. There is information regarding alternate animal facilities, emergency and operations loans and volunteer organizations. The information will be updated as it becomes available. Commissioner Corbus stated that there is also a concern of the wildlife that will be displaced due to the fires and the ranchers may be inundated with wildlife looking for what grazing and food is left. Chairman Hofer suggested setting up feed stations for the wildlife. The Board thanked everyone for coming and will continue future meetings and updates regarding the issued discussed.
