The Department of Commerce is urging businesses to fill out the form and forward it to Jerry Miller even if you do not plan to apply for the SBA financial assistance yourself. Filling out and submitting the form assists other Idaho businesses who may apply.

Idaho Commerce along with the Idaho Office of Emergency Management is working to secure U.S. Small Business Administration – Economic Injury Disaster Loan Assistance for small businesses impacted by COVID-19. To become eligible for assistance we need affected Idaho businesses to file with Commerce, SBA's Economic Injury Worksheet. The Economic Injury Worksheet and other supporting materials may be found on Commerce's COVID-19 page. The assistance is available to both for and not-for-profit businesses. ## Information about Covid-19 (Coronavirus) and Unemployment Insurance

Unemployment insurance is a program for workers unemployed through no fault of their own and is not a paid sick leave program. An individual whose workplace is temporarily or permanently closed may file a claim for unemployment. In order to be eligible, the individual must be physically and mentally able to work and be available for work at the time of filing the claim.
